





- Materials & furnishing







































RESIDENTS SHARED CONSENSUS TO...

Improve the ecology of the park through design

Diversify pathways, levels of activity, and seating

Expand pedestrian activity and safety

Include place-making elements such as storm water gardens, street trees and street seatings as long as they were safe and well-maintained

Add bike facilities where street parking is limited or removed

RANGE OF IDEAS FOR...

Phasing, implementation, and public communication

Full support to cautious agreement around the final plan

FOCUS

General information about the Burlington City Hall Park including design intentions, governance structure, and ownership.

WE LEARNED...

The design balances green passives spaces with programmed hardscape, and historic preservations with new uses

Ecological function and aesthetics of healthy trees and storm water handling were of high importance

Significant historical features to enhance were: 1. Open space identity 2. Gathering space with a water feature 3. Visible landmarks and views







Project Schedule

Refinement of Concepts: Now through May

Design Permitting: May 2022 through Summer 2023

Construction: Begining Fall 2023 (expected min. of two years)

Let's talk construction!

Businesses will be allowed to remain open throughout construction. There may be changes to traffic patterns, and the management of traffic flow has yet to worked out. Access to all buildings/businesses must be maintained whenever possible, disruptions must be kept to a minimum, and any interruptions must be discussed with the affected owners in advance.

On town meeting day, the city will be asked to vote on a bond relating to this project.

\$25,920,000 of *new* debt request

\$4,580,000 remaining from 2015 Bond Vote, to be used towards Main Street.

\$1,470,000 *new* related costs

Taxes do not increase to repay TIF debt
