

### **FOUNTAIN**

- Old horse trough installed 1976
- Basin in poor condition
- Wading prohibited unsanitary
- Turned off 9 months of the year
- Serves as an informal seating edge








### **EXISTING PAVING**

- Variety of materials
- In poor condition/ patchwork
- Insufficient path widths (5′-10′)
- Materials need to be durable











### **Site Analysis**

### SOIL COMPACTION/ EROSION

- Soil Compaction throughout
- Leads to erosion and stormwater problems
- Adds to silt problems










### **Site Analysis**

### SECURITY & VISIBILITY

- Strong Police Presence
- Dense tree canopy blocks sunlight & obscures views of City Hall & Buildings
- Low branching trees pose security concerns










### **Site Analysis**

### TREE CANOPY & AGE

- Historically (Mid 1800s ) Elm trees were limbed up which provided GOOD visibility throughout the Park
- In the mid 1980s only a few large trees existed in the Park. Unfortunately, today these trees do not exist.

DEVELOPED SCHEMATIC SITE PLAN (2011-2012)




Park Boundary & New Survey Area = 78,255 sf (1.8 ac.) STREET ST PAUL CITY HALL


